

# Aussies avoiding \$40 billion worth of jobs around the home

**EMBARGOED until 00:01, Thursday 27 February 2020 (Sydney, Australia)** – New research commissioned by hipages has revealed that Aussies have accumulated an astounding \$40 billion worth of maintenance work around the home over the past year, with most jobs put off for six months or more. This equates to 80 million outstanding repair and maintenance projects in Australian homes.

Whilst these figures are alarming, the start of a new decade is a motivator for ticking jobs off the to-do list. hipages, Australia’s leading online marketplace for trusted tradies, is urging homeowners to make the most of the extra 24 hours this year on 29 February 2020, and embrace the Saturday as ‘Get It Done Day’.

Stuart Tucker, hipages’ Chief Customer Officer says, “We know there are a variety of factors which delay us completing jobs around the home – whether it be lack of time, expertise or money. We want to show Australians how easy it is to ‘Get It Done’ with the help of trusted tradies from hipages and inspire everyone to make the most of their extra 24 hours this year. We’ve therefore dubbed 29 February 2020 as Get It Done Day!”

### **What are Australians putting off?**

The national study by YouGov Galaxy Research shows that we’re all in this together, with almost every household (92%) having at least one job that has been put off – with cleaning (73%), general home maintenance (67%) and gardening (63%) accounting for the largest volume of jobs on to-do lists. Whilst most households have multiple cleaning jobs to get done, 64% of these are only delayed for a maximum of three weeks, or less.

On the other hand more time intensive jobs, like painting, are more likely to be put off for over a year. Other projects that Aussies appear happy to postpone for six months or more are those where a tradie is required, including; concreting (2.3 million jobs), plastering (2.6 million jobs) and carpentry (3.3 million jobs).

“We know 79% of homeowners have used a tradie in the past 12 months, with full time workers more likely hire a tradie to help. Whilst most Aussies still turn to tradies they’ve hired previously (47%), or ones recommended by friends and relatives (47%), we’ve seen an increasing number of homeowners seeking on-demand tradies via hipages using our

simple three step process – post a job to the app, get connected with up to three tradies, book your preferred tradie to Get It Done,” says Tucker.

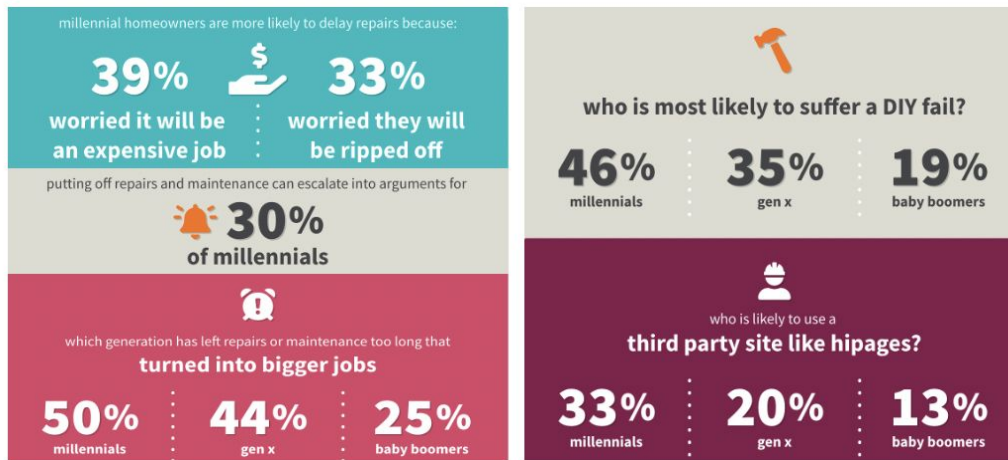
Looking across the states, Victoria has the highest proportion of households who have put off jobs for a year or more. These jobs include painting (19%), tiling (9%), plumbing (9%) and electrical works (9% for a year or more). This is followed by South Australian households who have delayed general home maintenance (16%), fencing (14%) and garden maintenance (12%) for a year or more.

Those in South Australia estimate that they would have the highest expense should a tradie fix all outstanding issues, at \$5,254 per household, whilst the national average is approximately \$5,000.

**Why are jobs being put off and what is the result?**

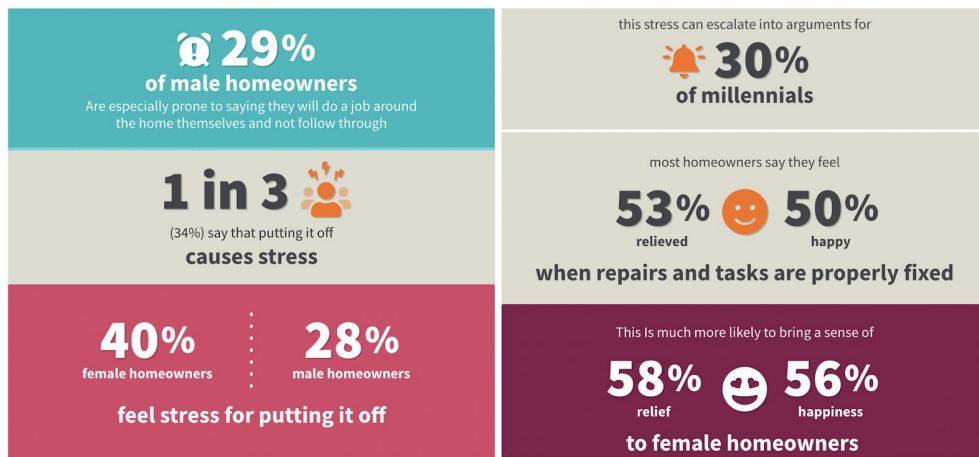
The most common reason cited by homeowners for putting off jobs is due to financial concerns (60%) with 44% of mortgage payers saying that not having money is a major cause of delay. 80% of homeowners, however, recognise there are consequences for putting off repairs and maintenance to the home.



“If you have a number of little jobs piling up, consider grouping the jobs by trade. Get an electrician to look at all lighting and fixture issues you may have at once or a plumber to get those jobs done in your bathroom, kitchen and laundry. Ensure you agree to all the jobs upfront with your tradie before they arrive,” he added.

Victorian homeowner, Sarah Ferris, understands the financial pressure of home repairs all too well. The roof of her home had deteriorated over 13 years, which she has delayed fixing for the past eight months due to the financial investment.

“I knew it would cost a lot to repair my roof, so I avoided the job as long as I could. Possums had snuck in causing sleepless nights due to the sounds of them scurrying around in the roof,” says Sarah. “When I couldn’t put it off any longer I got a loan from the bank and organised a tradie from hipages to fix my roof. I’m now getting plenty of sleep once again,” she added.



“If you can afford to, it’s best to manage maintenance and repairs as soon as possible, with a licenced professional, as this usually has the least expensive outcome. The survey was conducted by YouGov Galaxy Research amongst a nationally representative sample of 1,514 Australians 18 years and older. Fieldwork commenced on Thursday 14 November and was completed on Sunday 17 November, 2019. Following the completion of interviewing, the data was weighted by household size using the latest Australian Bureau of Statistics estimates.
